C. Matters for Discussion

C.1 COVID-19 Update – Mayor Soever

- Grey and Bruce Counties are currently straddling the green and yellow regions
- 1 variant case that does not pose a risk to the public has been identified
- Councillor Sampson questioned whether Public Health or the Province has identified a clear COVID-19 exit strategy, and it was noted that no such strategy has been confirmed – Councillor Bordignon noted it is important to have a sense of hope regarding a return to normalcy
- Mayor Soever reviewed the vaccine arrival and distribution in Grey/Bruce –
 noted the need to prioritize vaccination of elderly residents and also advised that
 he has requested a vaccination hub in The Blue Mountains
 - Andrew Siegwart offered conference space if necessary during this process

C.2 Food Security Discussion – all members

- Noted general increase in community meals demands, and visits to the Beaver Valley Outreach
- Mayor Soever noted that if any organization in The Blue Mountains distributing meals requires face shields or Personal Protective Equipment, to reach out to the Town
- Beaver Valley Outreach is also providing themed bags for pick up (i.e. breakfast, chili, baking, condiment, etc bags)
- Beaver Valley Outreach has been assisting with food needs and also rent and utility payments, and has plans to expand the community garden
- St. George's Anglican Church has also provided housing assistance to families and is noticing an increased need
- Councillor Sampson noted that perhaps The Blue Mountains Attainable Housing Corporation would be able to assist with short-term housing needs

C.3 Updates from Task Force Advisory Participants

Andrew Siegwart

- Slow return to Blue Mountain Village operations with ambassador teams set up onsite to reinforce safety controls and protocols
- Operating numbers are approximately ½ of what they would normally be
- General consumer is still cautious about indoor dining, but safety protocols and consumer education is helping
- Noted there is not the same volume of out-of-area guests

Derek Hammond

- 300% increase in revenues over the previous week
- Outdoor "igloo" seating is proving popular with most individuals uncomfortable still with indoor seating

Carolyn Letourneau

- Seniors Centre Without Walls message shared, which highlighted the need to safely engage seniors, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic
 - o 5 programs per week, with 10-12 people calling in every day
 - Mayor Soever to speak to the Seniors Centre Without Walls programming during weekly meeting
 - Mayor Soever noted that in a Police Services Board meeting, mental health needs are increasing in the region
 - o Beaver Valley Outreach is starting an Elder Abuse Prevention Podcast
