C.1 University of Guelph R2B2 Program and RABIT Task Force – CAO Shawn Everitt

- D. To include updated Telecommunication Facility/Infrastructure policies in the Official Plan through the upcoming 5-year review exercise, which includes reference to the

Municipal Protocol for Establishing Telecommunication Facilities and any relevant findings as a result of item B and/or C, CARRIED.
