A. Call to Order

Deputy Mayor Potter called the meeting to order at 11:01 a.m. with Mayor Soever and Councillor Sampson present.

C.1 Internet Speed Test Challenge Update

• # of Tests completed

- Executive Assistant Committees of Council Sarah Merrifield noted that CIRA would be provided the analytics from the internet speed test challenge. Sarah noted that a press release had been issued the previous week to encourage residents to take part in the speed test challenge and noted that Deputy Mayor Potter had attended the Agricultural Advisory Committee meeting on June 17, and that his presentation was well-received by Committee Members.
- Sarah noted that 2287 tests had been completed to date. Deputy Mayor Potter noted that it was nice to see a more even spread of the tests completed in the rural areas and noted that this was a good sampling of the town.
- Mayor Soever noted that feedback should be provided to CIRA regarding the issues of people trying to drag the locate icon to their property.

Quotation from CIRA for detailed Data Analysis

Mayor Soever asked when the Task Force would be receiving a quotation from CIRA. Chief Administrative Officer Shawn Everitt noted that Manager of Communications and Economic Development would provide an update on this issue for the next Task Force meeting and noted that staff could provide a report on this issue for the August Committee of the Whole meeting. Shawn Everitt noted that staff would internally follow-up with CIRA.

C.2 Resolution to Council to continue Task Force

Deputy Mayor Potter advised he would prepare for Task Force review a report to be provided to Committee of the Whole outlining the next steps that the Task Force would be undertaking and requesting an extension of the Task Force into 2022 from Council.

Deputy Mayor Potter asked if the Task Force should continue to meet every 2 weeks. Mayor Soever noted that the Task Force could meet once more prior to Council's summer break. Shawn Everitt noted that if the Task Force chose to meet on or before July 9, 2021 that the forthcoming report from Deputy Mayor Potter could be included on the August 10, 2021 Committee of the Whole agenda.

 - Shawn Carey noted that the challenge of obtaining timely utility locates and determining any potential cost-sharing arrangements would need to be considered. Shawn Carey noted that everyone was struggling to receive timely locates at this time.
 - Mayor Soever asked if it was legislated that locates were only approved for a 6 month period. Shawn Carey noted that the Ontario One Call had the 6 month period to protect themselves for liability and in the event that emergency utility work was required. Councillor Sampson noted that he would reach out to the province on this issue and requested that Shawn Carey reach out to him on this issue, which Shawn Carey confirmed he would do.
