Title: Follow-up to Public Meeting Options to Regulate Fireworks

A. Recommendations

THAT Council receive Staff Report FAF.22.075, entitled "Follow-up to Public Meeting Options to Regulate Fireworks" for information;

AND THAT Council direct Staff to pursue Option ____, as discussed at the March 7 Public Meeting, and prepare a draft by-law for Council's consideration.

B. Overview

This report provides a follow up to the March 7, 2022, Public Meeting regarding the Options to Regulate Fireworks.

C. Background

At the November 29, 2021, Council meeting, Council approved the recommendations from Staff Report <u>FAF.21.195</u> that included the recommendation to proceed to a Public Meeting to consider the Options to Regulate Fireworks.

The Public Meeting was scheduled for March 7, 2022, and notice was provided in accordance with the town's Provision of Notice and Manner of Giving Notice to the Public Policy, <u>POL-COR-07-03</u> with notice being posted on the Town website on January 24, 2022, and advertised in the Collingwood Connection on February 17, 2022 and February 24, 2022.

D. Analysis

Town Staff provided a brief presentation at the March 7, 2022, Public Meeting which outlined 5 options to regulate fireworks:

- 1. Status Quo
- 2. Enhanced Noise By-law
- 3. Permit System
- 4. Partial Prohibition (permitted on/around certain holidays)

5. Complete prohibition

Below is a summary of the relevant/applicable public comments received by the Town.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

- Should be no sales and no residential usage
- Limited authorized usage for commercial/official events
- Calling the OPP on many occasions for irresponsible usage
- Support strict regulation and/or prohibition.
- A common interest in the area is the natural resources including the small-town feel, the bay, Escarpment, trail systems and access to nature
- Hear the "booms" coming from firework celebrations and can be felt in the ground
- The impact on pets such as dogs under furniture and lost dogs
- Hopefully a "Greener" method can be considered
- Happy that this issue is being considered by council.
- Fireworks are very detrimental to people, wildlife and pets which causes stress
- In a climate crisis now and we need to curtail any unnecessary combustion activities that may increase forest fires
- Impacts war veterans with PTSD due to loud bangs and flashes of fireworks
- Many communities across Ontario are looking to regulate and possibly ban fireworks
- Fireworks are very loud and disturbing
- They scare wildlife and pets
- Interrupt people's sleep
- Fire hazard
- Waste of money, natural resource and pollute the air and ground below
- Find other way to celebrate
- Ban fireworks forever
- A ban on fireworks is generally ineffective, recommend permitting fireworks on certain holidays, and requiring permits for all other days.
- The Town should not interfere and should let residents use fireworks.
