C. Correspondence

C.1 Jackie Stewart and Linda Wykes Re: Blue Mountain Legacy Fund Request for Support

Note: This item referred to the Grants and Donations Committee by Council at the June 6, 2022 Council Meeting.

THAT Council of the Town of The Blue Mountains receives for information the May 26, 2022 correspondence from the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund regarding request for support;

AND THAT Council refers the request to the Grants and Donations Committee for a report back to Council, in consultation with staff;

AND THAT Council approves the scheduling of a Grants and Donations Committee Meeting, solely for the consideration of this matter, CARRIED.

Deputy Mayor Bordignon provided an overview of the resolution passed at the June 6, 2022 Council meeting and provided an overview of the correspondence referred to the Committee.

Deputy Mayor Bordignon noted that the Committee had previously considered whether it was worthwhile to set up another registered charitable foundation as it would duplicate the efforts of the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund set up by Jackie Stewart and Linda Wykes. Deputy Mayor Bordignon noted that the Town Grants and Donations Committee was still needed regardless of a local foundation being set up to ensure that funding could be provided to local community groups that were not registered charities and to continue with fundraising events. Deputy Mayor Bordignon noted that Town staff were reviewing the option of completing a Memorandum of Understanding between the Town Grants and Donations Committee and the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund to work as partners on fundraising events. Deputy Mayor Bordignon asked if the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund has received Canada Revenue Agency registered status, which Linda confirmed that they had.

Caroline Harbinson asked if the Grants and Donations Committee would still have full determination over where money raised from Committee-led events would be awarded. Linda advised that the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund invested funding received with the Community Foundation Grey Bruce and that the purpose of the fund was to generate funding through money invested rather than always having to fundraise to distribute to community groups. Deputy Mayor Bordignon noted that the Committee would still have the authority to award funds to local community groups and other charities from the money raised by the Committee. The Committee discussed the need to meet again to do a call-out to community groups for requests for funding.

Marc Anthony Venere asked if the money raised through the Committee-led fundraising events would be tracked as two different revenue streams, one being geared towards deriving returns from capital and the second stream as a vehicle for large donations to be earmarked to go back to the Town in some manner, or if large donations would be used to achieve the goal of the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund reaching the \$1 million dollar contribution to generate a 4% return on the investment. Linda noted that any initiatives from Committee-raised funds, less expenses, would be given back to the Town. Deputy Mayor Bordignon noted that the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund was more of an administrative vehicle for the Committee to partner with for large donations and bequeathments.

Michael Caron left the meeting at 10:25 a.m.

Marc asked if there was someone in the foundation who would be drawing administration fees. Linda advised that based on an 8% return from the Community Foundation Grey Bruce that 2% of the income earned remained in the account, that 2% was dispersed between the Community Foundation Grey Bruce, the Community Foundation and the Investment Firm, and that a total of 4% would be available to be dispersed. Linda advised that as the fund generated more revenue that the Community Foundation Grey Bruce fees reduced. Linda advised that the Blue Mountain Legacy Fund would have to set up its own Board if it was not investing with Community Foundation Grey Bruce.

Deputy Mayor Bordignon thanked everyone for their discussion and consideration of the referred correspondence.

Marc Anthony Venere asked where the funds generated from the Turkey Trot would be spent.
