Our Purpose Today

Women living in rural communities are 75% more likely to be abused by their romantic partner than women living in urban centres. We are here to raise awareness of our programs and services available to women and their children in the Blue Mountains community and to share how they're being used currently.

Who We Serve

Women & their children in South Georgian Bay (Collingwood, Wasaga Beach, Clearview Township, The Blue Mountains & Meaford) who are fleeing abuse and women at risk of violence.

What We Do

- Residential shelter program for women and children
- 24/7 Crisis Line and Support Line
- Counselling VAW, Mental Health & Addictions, Child & Youth
- Transitional Housing and Legal Services

Programs & Services Offered

VAW Therapeutic Counselor Works directly with women who've suffered trauma due to abuse Child & Youth Workers Works directly with children who've suffered abuse

Wellness Coordinator

Provides mental health & addiction support Advocates on behalf of women for referral supports

Transitional House & Legal Services

Works with women to connect with housing opportunities Works with women on legal supports for court appearances, custody etc.

Collaborative Group Programming

Our team is able to work together to provide total care for our clients. All of this is available.

The Blue Mountains by the numbers

386 calls to our 24/7 crisis line in 2022 – we want to ensure women know about this and feel confident using this support

18 individuals were housed in our shelter in 2022.

21 women have accessed our VAW Therapeutic program.

11 women have received Transitional Housing and Legal support.

Women can also connect with our counselors over the phone for support with housing, legal services or VAW Therapy



Increased Outreach Needed

- Often women and youth cannot access services due to transportation, financial constraints, possible isolation – funding for these pieces in other communities has come from Service Clubs (like Rotary) and special events.
 - Clubs (like Rotary) and special events.
 Partnering with organizations like South Georgian Bay Community Health Centre, as we have in Wasaga Beach, increases
 - accessibility of our services
- We can provide reciprocal wrap around support for women and children by connecting with other agencies and appreciate any of your recommendations in the Thornbury area
