

Purpose Today


 For Council to be aware and acknowledge the current serious lack of access to local Primary Health Care


The New Reality . . .

- To have to access our local Emergency Departments for Primary Care
- Communities need to be acutely aware of the need to have access to Primary Care locally and recruit/retain more Family Physicians and or Nurse Practitioners to our area.





How many more Family Physicians will be required?...





Evidence of the Rising Local Need...

TBM Utilization of Meaford Emergency Department has increased by

26% during the period of 2021 to 2023

- Monitoring progress of chronic illnesses
- Cancer and disease screening
- Vaccinations


2.6.3 Prioritizing New Initiatives

When asked about prioritizing projects for the next term of Council, the highest priorities remained related to health care, followed by investing in infrastructure replacement and the preservation and retention of mature trees on public land.

76% of our resident responses indicated 'Increased Access to Family Health Care' was a High Priority!



Current Scenario of Family Physicians . . .


- 27% of Family Physicians in our Region are 60 years of age or older and therefore are nearing retirement
 - Due to their roster size, they cannot be replaced on a one-for-one basis
- NO Family Physicians are currently accepting new patients, except in very rare cases, when they may have treated a patient in an Emergency Department and require extensive follow-up given chronic conditions
- NO net new Family Physicians have been recruited to the area in the last decade
- The number of Family Physicians needed in our Region now is in excess of 20 and continues to grow which each new home built or family who decides to relocate to their seasonal home

- Two Nurse Practitioners have a wellestablished a private fee for service clinic located in The Blue Mountains and provide care for those:
 - Are not rostered to a Family Physicians in the region
 - Have a Family Physicians who are not located locally
