# A. Recommendations

THAT Council receive Staff Report CSOPS.24.037, entitled "Moreau Park Revitalization Survey Results" for information only;

# **B.** Overview

Staff are providing an update on the status of the Moreau Park Revitalization Project, including a summary of public survey results and an outline of the next steps to be completed.

# C. Background

The Thornbury-Clarksburg Rotary Club approached Town Council in September 2022 with the concept of revitalizing Moreau Park in Thornbury under the theme, "Kindness at Play." The elements proposed included a new skate park for all ages and abilities, a year-round paved walking path, a sensory garden and an accessible playground. Council directed staff to include this project for consideration as an addition to the 2023 Town budget. \$45,000 was approved through the budget to be utilized for communications, consulting and project management through 2023 and 2024.

In September 2023, the Town launched a survey to gather initial feedback from the community regarding the project and the elements proposed through the Rotary Club's "Kindness at Play" concept. It also included consideration of a number of elements identified through the Town's Leisure Activities Plan and Resident Satisfaction Survey. The survey closed on October 15, 2023 with a total of 764 responses.

The project team is now looking to engage a consultant to assist with creating the conceptual design, including preparing high-level cost estimates to help the Town make a fully-informed decision on the elements to be included in the final design for consideration in the 2025 budget process.

# D. Analysis

The initial public survey was open from September 20, 2023 to October 15, 2023. A total of 764 responses were received during this period. A detailed report of the survey findings has been included with this report as Attachment 1.

## Key Takeaways

## "Kindness at Play" Facility Priorities

The "Kindness at Play" initiative introduced several facilities for potential inclusion in the redevelopment plan. Respondents were asked to rate how important it was to them that each of these facilities be included in the revitalization plan.

The Town's Leisure Activity Plan and Resident Satisfaction Survey identified a number of facilities that could be included in the redevelopment plan. Respondents were asked to rate how important it was to them that each of these facilities be included in the revitalization plan.

In considering the addition of new features or facilities to Moreau Park, respondents were
asked about reallocating space currently occupied by existing facilities.

## Common Comment Trends

Respondents were asked for their additional thoughts, comments or concerns regarding the redevelopment of Moreau Park. The comments were reviewed, and the following are the key themes that emerged:

- While many are in support of improving the baseball infrastructure (diamonds, batting cages etc.) in the park, there is concern from survey respondents that the baseball diamonds are underutilized and should be reduced in number in favour of other amenities or located elsewhere.
- Respondents feel that many of the proposed amenities/ facilities are available elsewhere and therefore, are not needed at Moreau Park (e.g., parking, pickleball and tennis courts etc.) or should be located elsewhere (e.g., sensory garden etc.) Many are looking for improved or new amenities/ facilities that cannot be found elsewhere in the town.
- Respondents demonstrated very strong support for focusing on developing more facilities for the youth and children in the town (e.g., a skate park/ path, expanding and improving the playground, a bike pump track, an improved skateboard park, a splash pad etc.).
- Many respondents made calls to improve the dog park, even introduce an area limited to smaller dogs, while others suggest relocating the dog park to another part of the town.
- Other comments from respondents referred to the need for more washroom facilities, more trees, natural spaces and walking paths/ sidewalks, while others are concerned about costs, insurance liability and increased noise levels.

## E. Strategic Priorities

#### 1. Communication and Engagement

We will enhance communications and engagement between Town Staff, Town residents and stakeholders

#### 3. Community

We will protect and enhance the community feel and the character of the Town, while ensuring the responsible use of resources and restoration of nature.

#### 4. Quality of Life

We will foster a high quality of life for full-time and part-time residents of all ages and stages, while welcoming visitors.

## F. Environmental Impacts

Environmental impacts will be considered through design and construction. Preliminary conversations have taken place with local groups to participate in tree and some natural elements.
