Hello Paula,

Further to our conversation last week, I would appreciate it if you would bring forward to the appropriate forum this request to consider lowering the speed limit on Cameron Street, Thornbury. The Town of The Blue Mountains, Transportation Master Plan classifies Cameron Street as Local Urban, though Cameron Street falls short in the described improvement characteristics of the category. Cameron Street is a winding road paralleling the shoreline of Georgian Bay, has no sidewalks, street lights and minimal unpaved shoulders. See two attached photos. The width of the subject road pavement is 5.5 meters, sufficient for two vehicles to get by one another. Issues arise when there are pedestrians and pets also on the road. Many pedestrians will step into a driveway entrance to give way to vehicles traveling at the posted speed limit of 50 km/hr. The residents of Cameron Street are simply looking for a reduction in the posted speed limit to improve safety and enjoyment of all using Cameron Street. Our Transportation Master Plan recommends the posted speed limit for a road such as Cameron Street at 30 km/hr and that additional signage be posted identifying the right of way as a shared use environment.
