Subject: Parking on Carmichael Crescent - Request for Council Consideration

Please find a request for Council's Consideration.

My wife and I are writing to request that Parking be permitted on Carmichael Crescent in the Blue Mountains and that Council considers this request the Week of August 25

I have owned my property at [REDACTED] Carmichael Crescent since 1979 which was built on by me and my contractors in the early 1980's. I used my chalet on this property as a recreation home until the 1990's when it became my permanent home.

For the 40+ years family and friends visiting our home parked on the street when the driveway was full and no parking tickets wherever issued. Now one of our neighbour's sons has been ticketed for parking on our street.

Several years ago, the residents on our street requested a solution to preventing parking on Carmichael Crescent by day or weekend visitors to Blue Mountain Resort during busy periods when the Resort's parking lots were full. When these tourists parked on our street, it restricted parking for residents and their guests to park on the street, when it was necessary during visits to our homes.

The solution to our request was that the Town installed no parking signs on the first 100' or 200' at the two entrances to Carmichael Crescent. This action stopped visitors to Blue Mountain Resort from parking on our street. We were satisfied these signs were effective for our needs.

We understood parking on our street is never permitted by the bylaw which prevents nighttime parking in the winter so snowploughs can remove snow when required.

My wife seems to remember the Town only had 2 way no parking signs at that time in stock and advised us of this situation but that it would be Ok for residents and their visitors to park on the street beyond the no parking zones at the entrances to Carmichael Crescent.

We want visitors to our chalets to be able to park on our street, close to our homes, anytime with the exception of the winter night time parking restriction.

We would also like to understand how the parking restriction decision was made for Carmichael Crescent, that being no parking on the full length of the street on either side of the street.

We would also like to know what we need to do to have this designation changed.
