Hello Corinna,

I would like the opportunity to make a deputation at the next council meeting on Monday April 20 regarding the Campus of Care .

The announcement of the new location for a long care facility on Grey Road 19 disturbs me greatly. I would like to encourage council members to reconsider this decision.

My Dad Peter Moreau gave a lot to our community as a high school teacher, a town councillor, a visionary fundraiser for LE Shore, the Arena and Community Centre and his namesake Moreau Park.

He is in long term care in Chartwell in Collingwood. When he asks to move back home (each time I visit, with tears in his eyes), he does not mean a place next to a firehall on a major Craigleith artery - far away from stores, the legion, his friends and his community general.

I would be loathe to see our current council push this location and project through (when facing an imminent lame duck council) without appropriate communication to the community about this sudden change - to a property that has never been considered before.

There are three key reasons that the location is a bad choice for a senior's home:

- 1) If it is next to a firehall - alarms at all times of the day will be very disruptive
- 2) Finding staff to fulfill the roles at the resort and private clubs is already a huge problem. Where will the staff for this residence come from?
- 3) Life up here is such that generally residents move from their homes or chalets TO a smaller more accessible place in town as they age so that they can be close to sidewalks, stores, medical facilities, etc. it does not make sense for them to have to move to an isolated location such as this.
