### A. Recommendations

---

THAT Council receive Staff Report CS.26.025, entitled "Special Events 2026 and Request for By-Law Relief";

AND THAT Council grant conditional relief to the Noise By-law for the dates and times identified in table "A";

AND THAT Council approve the road closures identified in table "B".

### B. Overview

---

This report outlines the upcoming 2026 Special Events taking place within the Town of The Blue Mountains that require Council approval for temporary road closures and/or relief from the Town's Noise By-law. Additional requests will come forward when the applications or additional details are received by staff.

### C. Background

---

The Community Services Department facilitates the Town's Special Event Permit process. The following events require Council approval for road closures and/or exemptions to the Noise By-law being proposed through the application process:

1. Farmer's Market

The Thornbury Farmer's Market takes place at Smith Memorial Park and provides fresh produce, meat, cheese, natural products, etc. The market has an agreement with the Town and is inspected by the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

2. Clarksburg Kid's Fest

Clarksburg Kids Fest takes place at Lion's Park and is hosted by the Clarksburg Village Association. There will be children's activities, arts, crafts, vendors, dancing, and demonstrations.

3. Multicultural Day

Multicultural Day takes place at Moreau Park and is hosted by YMCA Owen Sound Grey Bruce Settlement and Language Services. This is a family-friendly community event celebrating cultures from around the world and bringing people together through food, music, art, and cultural expression. This is a free event that will include children's activities, live entertainment, artisan and vendor market as well as food vendors for purchase.

4. Canada Day Parade and Bruce St. Events

The Canada Day Parade will begin in Clarksburg and end in Thornbury with a variety of parade participants including classic cars, children, Fire trucks, circus performers, local service clubs and music.

5. Arts Walk

This one-day event will include galleries, businesses, restaurants, the L.E. Shore Library, parks/parkettes, and homes between the Downtown Thornbury and the Downtown Clarksburg districts. Artists of various media will be invited to set up at these participating locations and encourage the public to take the 2.2km walk between the Bob Gamble Parkette at The Georgian Trail and Bruce St N in Thornbury and the Marsh St at Clark intersection in Clarksburg.

6. Touch of Taryn

Charity Baseball tournament located at Moreau Park. Includes live entertainment and announcements. All funds raised go back into the community.

7. Beaver Valley Fall Fair

The Beaver Valley Fall Fair is hosted by the Beaver Valley Agricultural Society at the Beaver Valley Community Centre and Moreau Park. This event celebrates agriculture in the community and is a fundraiser for the Beaver Valley Agricultural Society.

8. Rotary Turkey Trot (Half Marathon)

This event is hosted by the Thornbury Clarksburg Rotary Club and incorporates a free 1km fun run for children and for those with limited physical capacity. There are also 5km, 10km and 21km runs that are more competitive and require an entry fee.

9. Remembrance Day Services/Girl Guides – Candlelight Remembrance Service

These events take place at Jack Acres Park (new cenotaph at the corner of Bruce St and Marsh St.) and Ravenna Community Park. Each service includes representation from the Clarksburg Legion.

10. Olde Fashioned Christmas

This event takes place on Bruce St. and Town Hall Park. This event is hosted by the Thornbury Business Improvement Area. Elements include face painting, visits with Santa, music, hot chocolate, dancing, tree lighting, and vendor market.

**D. Analysis**

Staff recommend granting conditional relief to the Noise By-Law, contingent upon absence of negative feedback from noise relief circulations to the public.

Sunday, June 14	10am – 3pm	Clarksburg Kid’s Fest	Lion’s Park Lane (Clark St. to Lion’s Park including the parking lot)	Closure of Lion’s Park Lane and the parking lot to allow for safe use of the area during the event without vehicle traffic.
Monday, July 1	10am – 3pm	Canada Day Parade	Marsh St. and Bruce St. (Clark St. to Arthur St. W / Hwy 26)	This temporary road closure follows the parade from Marsh St. to Bruce St. and stops on Bruce St. until 2pm and will maintain the closure between Louisa St. and Arthur St. (Hwy 26)
Saturday, September 12	9am – 5pm	Beaver Valley Fall Fair	Victoria St. South from Alfred St. to Alice St.	This section is closed due to high levels of foot traffic from BVCC and Moreau Park.

If food is being served, the Grey Bruce Public Health Unit is consulted and if alcohol is served the Alcohol Gaming Commission of Ontario is consulted.

Bylaw relief requests are circulated to properties within 120 metres of the road closure or source of noise.

At the time of writing this report, no concerns have been raised.
