**Subject:** Questions for the Agricultural Advisory Committee

These are questions to the members of the Agricultural Advisory Committee:

Why do you keep recommending that the town spray a toxic chemical like Truvist or Navius on the road allowance? Do you speak for all the farmers in this area or are you just a minority with a loud voice and a public platform? I ask because when I went for a short drive on May 24, more than a week after the spraying of the roadsides was completed, I saw a number of cultivated fields surrounded by wild chervil and orchards infested with wild chervil. If these farmers don't mind the wild chervil in or adjacent to their fields, why does the town keep spraying the road allowance where there is so little wild chervil? What is the point?
