#### B. Overview

This report presents the Town of The Blue Mountains Fire Department 2021 Annual Report.

## C. Background

The Fire Chief provides regular update reporting of Fire Service activities to Council. As per Section 7.3(k) of the Fire Dept. Establishing and Regulating By-Law 2020-10.

#### D. Analysis

The 2021 Blue Mountains Fire Department Annual Report is attached. The report contains statistics and analysis of key fire service performance indicators. Highlights include:

- A slight increase in emergency calls for service, and a total fire loss of \$8,384,000 between 6 fire events.
- Fire Prevention commercial inspections were stopped due to COVID-19
- Short-term accommodation license renewal inspections and complaint inspections continued with Fire Department staff attending with PPE and COVID protocols in place for the safety of the inspectors and the business or homeowners.
- Training for the volunteer and the recruitment class of 2021 continued in smaller platoons and online. The 2021 class of recruits tested, and 5 candidates are now responding to emergency classes. A new class of 8 volunteer Firefighter candidates were hired in December 2021.
- Award of the Fire Master Plan to Emergency Management Group.
- Declared emergency continued for the Town due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Management program requirements for 2021 reverted back to normal

regulatory requirements and the Emergency Management Program achieved certified compliance through Emergency Management Ontario, as required by the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act.

#### 1. Communication and Engagement

We will enhance communications and engagement between Town Staff, Town residents and stakeholders

#### 3. Community

We will protect and enhance the community feel and the character of the Town, while ensuring the responsible use of resources and restoration of nature.

We will foster a high quality of life for full-time and part-time residents of all ages and stages, while welcoming visitors.
